Supply list for Houndstooth Quilt by Sue Gross

Fabric

3 or 5 yards **EACH** of a light and dark print or solid. The smaller the square you choose the more fabric you will need to accommodate for seam allowances.

Tools

A triangle ruler

Any of the following square rulers: 4-1/2 inch, 3 to 3-1/2 square ruler, or 6-1/2.

A small mat is helpful to trim blocks at your table.

Note:

Sue will be teaching a jacket class at fall flurries. She plans to use this as the jacket. So it must be quilted, but not bound.

Supply List for Twist and Turn

- 1. Book; Twist and Turn by Sharon Craig. (If you can find it). This book is currently out of print, but available used on Amazon. Or maybe you can borrow it from a current member. Not necessary to have, but the examples are great.
- 2. Sewing machine with standard supplies, thread etc.
- 3. Rotary cutter
- 4. Rulers
 - A. square 8 in or larger
 - B. strip 6" x 12" or longer
- 5. Blocks (squares) to be framed. A good start is to have 4 to 9 blocks/squares.

Any size is OK, but you will find it easier if they are not too small.

- A. Orphan blocks
- B. Block of the month
- C. Cuts from Printed fabrics (animals, flowers, etc) that show similar "item" or "themes."
- 6. Fabrics for the frames.
 - A. Cut 2 or 3 strips from the width of fabric
 - B. Cut mostly 2 1/2 strips, but if your blocks are small, include some 1 1/2 strips
 - C. If your blocks/cuts are fairly large, cut some 3 1/2 strips
 - D. Try to have at least 5 to 10 different fabrics.
 - E Your strips should be complimentary to the blocks/squares, but should not overpower them. You can be as conservative or wild as you like.
 - F. If in doubt, bring more strips.
