TESSA QUILT

A complicated looking, but easily pieced quilt that is a perfect way to use a collection or theme.

I'm considering a Flamingo theme! The class sample is made with Christmas fabrics.

You may pre-order the quilt pattern as a PDF download from KitchenTableQuilting.com. My suggestion would be to pre-cut your wof strips ahead of class so you can dive right into sewing your strips together. I have a copy of the queen & king fabric requirements if anyone wants to make a larger version - just drop me an email (akartbug@yahoo.com) & I will send you the info.

Supply List: Fabric, according to pattern requirements for the size you choose to make. Rotary Cutter; Ruler, min. 6.5x12", cutting mat; Sewing machine in good working order, thread, and a few full bobbins.

CRUMB QUILT BLOCK

Raid your scrap bins! Bring leftover binding pieces; end cuts from strip piecing; unused block units; & all manner of scrappy strips that were too good to toss. We will randomly piece them together into new blocks that can be used 'as is' or as the beginnings of star blocks, snowballs, or whatever else we can dream up.

Supply List: Fabric scraps!! Sewing machine in good working order, thread, and a few full bobbins. Also handy would be a small craft iron & mat to have at your table to 'press as you go'

I will be doing a couple demos of other 'scrap busting' blocks. If you want to play along, bring:

(2) Contrasting 10" squares and a 1.5" wof strip each of black & white
and a second set of (2) Contrasting 10" squares

FAT QUARTER PLACEMATS

Makes four placemats

- Rotary cutter and ruler (at least 12" long)
- 4 fat quarters that "go together " Can be 2 pairs or all different
- 1 yard backing fabric.
- 1 yard (mostly) cotton batting. I will provide Warm and Natural if you want to use it.

Thread for quilting the mats

Walking foot (optional if you have one) for quilting.

General Sewing supplies

BOBBY'S MYSTERY BAG

Supply list:

- (21) 5" squares of fabric or 1/2 a charms pack
- 3/4 yd Cotton fabric for lining & pocket
- 7" x 24" mid weight interfacing
- Contrasting thread for topstitching
- Marking pen or chalk
- Sewing machine and thread

SEAT BELT COVERS

To make two seat belt covers, you will need:

- 1 Fat quarter or equivalent yardage
- 2 each 6 x 12 pieces of Soft n Stable or similar foam*
- 22" hook and loop sew on Velcro. The color doesn't matter as it will be hidden.
- Coordinating thread
- Walking foot if you need it for simple straight line quilting.

*I'll have some Soft n Stable and Velcro on hand to share.
